

After completing your collection

Urine samples should be returned to lab as soon as possible.

If keeping collection over a couple of days store out of direct sunlight and away from heat sources.

Please return all unused containers.

Norfolk and Norwich Hospital Delivery

The complete collection can be delivered either by yourself direct to the laboratory at the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital. The laboratory is located in the East Block, Level 1 and marked Pathology department. We are open 24hrs a day 7 days a week.

GP Delivery

Alternatingly urines can be delivered to your GP surgery who will place it on their next delivery to the laboratory.

James Paget Hospital Delivery

Deliveries to James Paget Hospital is possible, follow signs to Pathology where you will find window which it can be handed into.

Queen Elizabeth Delivery

Deliveries to Queen Elizabeth Hospital is possible. Follow signs Pathology where they is a phone, follow instructions and someone will come and help you

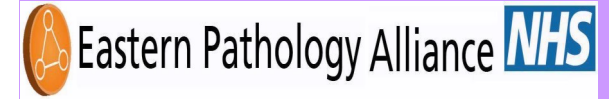

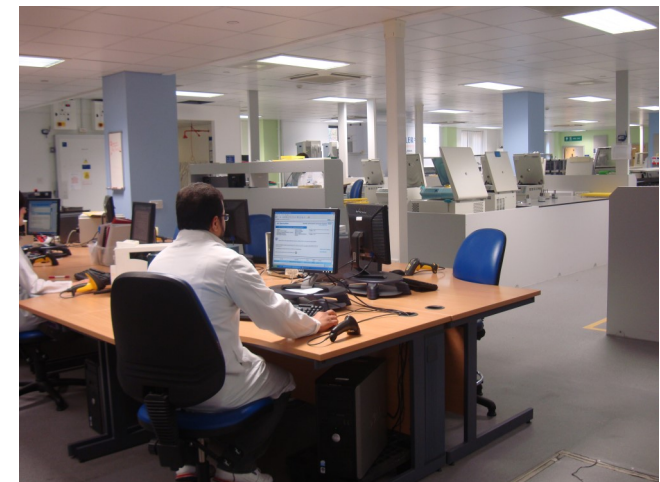

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COLLECTION OF URINARY HIAA PATIENT INFORMATION

Department of Clinical Biochemistry



This leaflet is intended for all patients who have been asked to collect a 24 hour urine sample at home by their clinician (Doctor/Nurse).

Please read the instructions carefully, make sure you are prepared, and follow each of the steps to ensure proper collection.

Materials Supplied

Five litre container

Green plastic carrier bag with pocket for request form.

Before you start your collection

If you expect to produce more than five litres in 24hrs, please ask for a second container.

Other containers such as plastic milk bottles will not be suitable or accepted.

Patient Advice—**IMPORTANT**

Patients are advised to avoid eating, drinking or taking the following while you are collecting the sample and for two days before you start collection.

Alcohol, Avocados, Bananas, Kiwi Fruit, Pineapples, Red Plums, Tomatoes, Walnuts, Cough mixture and Paracetamol.

These are to be avoided to ensure that the level of 5-HIAA is not falsely raised.

Instructions

There may be a small amount of liquid in the container, **please do not discard or rinse out.**

Note any warnings or instructions which may be printed on the side of the container.

It is essential that this procedure is followed very carefully.

Test results are based on the total amount of urine passed by your body over a 24 hour period.

You should aim to collect every drop of your urine during the specified 24 hour period.

It does not matter what the amount of the urine is, as long as it represents every drop that you passed.

If you have bowel movement, you must collect the urine separately.

Please do not pass urine directly into the container. Collect into a clean, dry, non-metallic receptacle (such as a jug or bowl) and then pour into the container. It is most important that you collect the urine as follows:

1. Begin at the usual time that you wake.
2. At that time, pass your urine, flush it down the toilet and note the exact time. You will now have an empty bladder and an empty bottle. The collection of the urine will start from this time. **Please note both the date and time on the collection bottle label, where it states 'start date and time'.**
3. Collect every drop you pass during the day and night, for 24hrs, and finish the collection by passing urine exactly the same time the next morning. You should add this to the bottle.

4. Keep the sample container cool; closed and protected from light between each time you pass urine.
5. **Record the date and time you pass the last specimen on the collection bottle label, where it says 'Finish date and time'.**
6. Check that the bottle label contains your full name, date of birth, clinic or GP surgery that requested your urine collection.
7. Please check that the cap is firmly screwed onto the container. Place the request form into pocket on the carrier bag provided and place the sample container into the carrier bag.
8. If more than one 24 hour collection has been asked for, start collecting urine into the next container immediately as from stage 3. Once again please record the date and time on container.
