



(Acute Life-threatening Events, Recognition and Treatment)

A one-day multi-professional course, teaching registered staff a structured and prioritised approach to the assessment and management of the acutely ill patient. The course involves pre-course reading of the ALERT manual provided, which must be collected at least 2-weeks prior to the course date.
