



## Allies Ophthalmology (Eye) Department Cromer Hospital Cataract Surgery Pre-operative Information

**Before your operation -** take tablets and medication as normal.

- Bring to hospital any medication that may be required e.g. for angina, asthma or diabetes.
- Wear comfortable clothing.
- Have something to eat and drink before you leave home.
- Do not wear any make-up.
- Bring your glasses with you.
- There are small lockers available for valuables and handbags.
- If your health status changes in any way before your operation, including starting antibiotics, or if you have any other concerns, please contact the Waiting List Co-ordinator on 01603 646202 or the Medical Secretaries 01603 646280 or 01603 646283 (Monday-Friday 9am-5pm)

## Day of your operation

- On arrival at the department you will be met by a member of the nursing team.
- You will be given an opportunity to discuss your surgery and asked to sign a consent form.
- Your vision will be checked and then drops will be put in to your eye to prepare it for surgery.
- Prior to operation you may have your eyes examined by the surgeon.
- You will be accompanied to and from the theatre by a member of the theatre team who will also hold your hand during the operation. This is not just for comfort but as a line of communication between you and the doctor.
- The operation is performed under local anaesthetic and takes between 15-30 minutes.
- During the operation you should keep your head still and lie as flat as possible.
- A clear shield will be placed over your eye at the end of the operation.
- You may be asked to return the day after surgery to have your eye pressure checked.
- When you get home, take it easy and rest.
- You may want to take a mild painkiller if you experience any discomfort.
- Do not drive on the day of your operation and until advised.

## After your operation

Following your operation if you have either

- Excessive pain.
- · Loss of vision.
- · Increasing redness of the eye.
- · Discharge or swelling of the eyelids.

If you need to contact us after your operation, we will need to know the date and type of operation you have had and your hospital number.

- Normal daily activities may be resumed after surgery unless otherwise advised.
- The eye may feel gritty due to the small wound in the eye.
- Do not touch or rub your eye, splash water in your eye, wear eye make-up or go swimming for 3 weeks due to the risk of infection.
- If your eye needs cleaning, use freshly boiled water that has been allowed to cool.
- Bathe gently using cotton wool pads and clean from the inside corner of the eye outwards.
- Use disposable tissues to dab tears away.
- Do not touch the actual eye.
- Instil your eye drops as prescribed, the instructions will be clearly written on the eye drop box or bottle.
- You will leave theatre wearing an eye shield to use at night-time for 2 weeks; apply
  with narrow surgical tape, remembering to wash the shield in soap and water each
  morning to keep it clean.
- In bright weather it may be necessary to wear sunglasses.
- You will be advised regarding your follow-up appointment, this may be at the hospital or with an optometrist in the community.
- Please remember to have these at home to use after the operation:
  - Cotton wool cosmetic pads.

- Surgical tape (½" width paper tape).
- o Mild analgesia (Paracetamol).
