

Department of Ophthalmology Instructions Following Eyelid Surgery

- The nurse will give you a follow-up appointment.
- Please ask the nurse about when you may return to work and drive again.
- After your operation, you will need to rest.
- You may take a mild painkiller eg paracetamol if you experience any discomfort. Do not take products containing Ibuprofen, or Aspirin, in the first 48 hours as these may increase the risk of bleeding and bruising.
- After your operation, your eyelids will be swollen, particularly for the first few days.
- The use of ice packs is recommended. Wrap a small pack of frozen peas in a clean tea towel and place over your eyelid for 5 minutes, 3-6 times per day for 2 days.
- If you are discharged home with a pad over your eye, please leave it in position until
- Use the eye drops/ointment as instructed.
- If you were on Aspirin before the operation (which is normally stopped 2 weeks before the operation), you can restart this the day after your operation.
- Do not rub your eye, or wear eye make-up for 2 weeks.
- Do not bend forward or lift heavy objects for 2 days.
- We recommend that you sleep with 2 or 3 pillows for the first 2-3 nights, this will help to minimalise bruising and swelling around the operation site.
- Following your operation, if you have excessive pain, loss of vision, increasing redness of your eye or discharge, please ring:-
