 What is a RIG tube? A RIG is a feeding tube that is placed into your stomach. It is a way of getting food, fluids and medicines into your stomach. 	
Why do I need a feeding tube?	
 Due to problems with your swallowing there is a risk of food and drink going the wrong way and in to your lungs. 	food
 If food and drink goes in to your lungs it may cause a chest infection and make you very poorly. 	tongue food pipe wind pipe
 Or you may not be eating and drinking enough. 	lungs stomach
