

Can you spot the difference between normal and abnormal cells?

The abnormal changes we look for in cells is called 'dyskaryosis'. This comes from some Greek words. 'Dys' which means abnormal and 'karyon' which means nucleus. Dyskaryosis is not cancer but in very occasional circumstances it could become so if it is left unchecked. To spot the 'dyskaryosis' we look at the nucleus and whether it has become bigger than it should be, or it may have become an odd shape. We also look at the material in the nucleus which is called chromatin. In normal cells this is spread evenly throughout the nucleus, but in the abnormal cells it may become darker and be unevenly spread.
