3) Purpose of the intended activities	The Blenrep Patient Support Programme (PSP), provides eye examinations and materials for monitoring of eye related adverse events for NHS patients where a decision to prescribe Blenrep has already been made. The PSP is being delivered by Apodi and funded by GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) as a Package Deal under Clause 19.1 of the Association of the British Pharmaceutical Industry (ABPI) Code of Practice. • GSK have introduced the PSP to facilitate eye examinations before the first four doses of belantamab mafodotin, and any subsequent examinations based on clinical need, in line with the products' Summary of Product Characteristics (SmPC) • The service allows for timely access for patients to treatment and monitoring • The service supports a reduction in requirement of NHS services and supports a reduction in waiting times for patients
